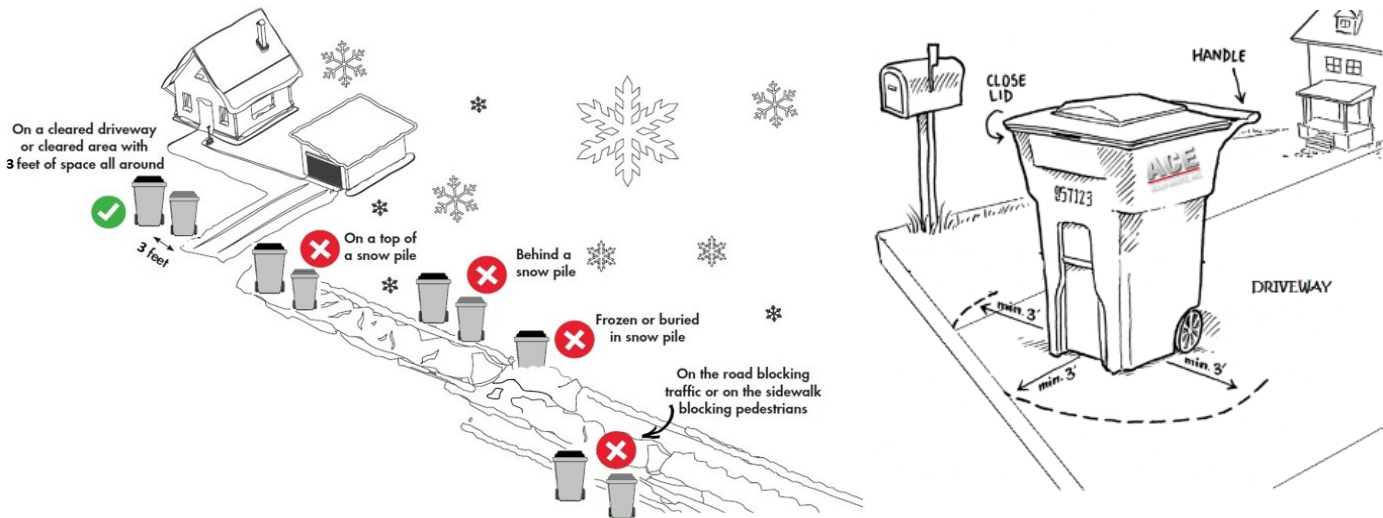


FALL newsletter



Placement

To create maximum safety and efficiency, please place your cart(s) no more than 3ft from the street and keep a 3ft clearance from other carts or obstructions such as mailboxes, light/utility poles, fire hydrants, low hanging branches, or vehicles.



Remember, container(s) should be streetside the night before or by 6:00 am to ensure collection! Start times in cities varies.

The 2025 Yard Waste collection will end the week of
November 24th, 2025

Weather Permitting

Only containers will be collected, no additional bags

Acceptable Materials:

- Small Branches/Brush
- Grass Clippings
- Leaves
- Garden Waste (old flowers and weeds)



Unacceptable Materials:

- Dirt
- Rocks
- Rolls of Sod
- Tree Stumps

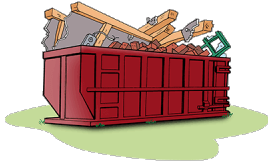


Minnesota state law prohibits mixing brush, tree or yard waste with your household garbage.

If yard waste is in your trash/recycling container, charges or service interruptions may be applied.

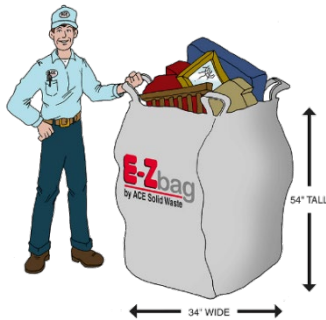
Fall Cleanup

Recycling in Specific Areas

KEEP IT LOOSE - DON'T BAG YOUR RECYCLABLES

Paper

- Newspapers and inserts
- Magazines and catalogs
- Mail and office papers

Cardboard & Boxes

- Corrugated cardboard
- Paperboard boxes
(e.g. cracker boxes)

Plastic

- Soda, juice and water bottles
- Milk and juice jugs
- Margarine, cottage cheese,
cream cheese and other tubs and lids
- Laundry detergent bottles and jugs
- Clear berry and produce containers

Glass Jars and Bottles

- Empty and rinse

Metal Cans

- Aluminum, tin and steel cans

Cartons

- Milk, soup, broth, and
wine cartons



NOT ACCEPTED!



Do not bag



No Plastic bags



No Food or Liquid



No hoses, wires,
or chains



No Sharps



No Batteries

Contamination charges or service interruptions may be applied if
non-recyclables are disposed of in your recycling container.

DIY Clean Container Instructions

**Before you pack away your hose for the winter...
give your containers a bath!**

For odor:

Use all-purpose cleaner, baking soda, bleach, or
vinegar and dish soap. Add cleaner to container
carefully, scrub, and spray out with outdoor hose.

For stuck on bottom residue:

Pour hot soapy water in the container and let it
soak for bottom residue.



Make sure that you
let the trash can dry
completely. If you
don't then you will
have created a new
breeding ground for
germs and smells,
because of the
moistness.
