Minimum fee (1 cubic yard or less) **\$40.50***

Over one cubic yard is **\$40.50*** per cubic yard.

*State Refuse Collection Tax of 3.6% has been added to all disposed waste charges



Items such as mattresses, furniture, appliances, and commercial waste may be taken to the Purdy Transfer Station or the Hidden Valley site in Puyallup.

Commercial Waste and Commercial Yard Waste can be taken to Purdy or Hidden Valley

Hazardous Materials are not accepted at the Key Center Transfer Station. Hazardous Materials may be taken to our Hidden Valley site Tuesdays and Thursdays only 8am-12pm and 1pm-5pm. For more info call 253-847-7555.

ORGANIC MATERIALS – YARD WASTE

PIERCE COUNTY RESIDENTIAL YARD WASTE

Residential yard waste is yard waste you bring in from your own home.

COST: NO CHARGE. Maximum of 5 cu. yds. per trip NO LANDCLEARING ALLOWED.

OUT OF COUNTY YARD WASTE

In accordance with the agreement between LRI & Pierce County, out of county yard waste will be charged **\$38.35 per cubic yard.**

Branches and roots must be less than 4" in diameter. Sod can be no thicker than 2 inches overall. Dirt cannot exceed 1½" of the sod.

MATERIALS NOT ALLOWED IN YARD WASTE

- Rocks, Pebbles, Sand or Dirt
- Plastic or Trash
- Bricks, Glass or Metal
- Twine or Wire
- Animal Waste
- *Straw and Hay not used as bedding accepted at Purdy & Hidden Valley sites.
- Noxious weeds or Fibrous plants

ALLOWED MATERIALS IN RESIDENTIAL YARD WASTE

- Grass clippings
- Leaves
- Weeds
- Brush
- Sod
- Branches
- Bark, clean sawdust, wood chips
- Food waste



Noxious weeds (ex: Tansy, Scotch broom, blackberries) are accepted at \$16.60 per cubic yard and **must be kept separate from other yard waste** and disposed of in the appropriate garbage area.

NOTICE! ABSOLUTELY NO TRASH IS ALLOWED IN YARD WASTE!

Loads containing any materials not allowed will be charged at the full garbage rate. If these non-allowed materials are found in yard waste, **YOU WILL BE CHARGED** for the whole load at garbage rates at the scale house. All Yard Waste **MUST** be removed from containers (bags, boxes) when unloading.

E-WASTE – ELECTRONICS RECYCLING PROGRAM

*******Available at Purdy, Hidden Valley and Prairie Ridge*******

What is E-Waste? E-Waste is just about anything electricity runs through. E-waste is a popular, informal name for electronic products nearing the end of their “useful life”. Computers, televisions, VCRs and more listed below are common electronic products. Many of these products can be reused, refurbished, or recycled. Unfortunately, electronic discards are one of the fastest growing segments of our nation’s waste stream. Many components or electronic equipment – including metals, plastic, and glass – can be reused or recycled, while others may present environmental hazards if not managed correctly. It is our goal at LRI to manage this ever-increasing waste efficiently and effectively.



Items below are accepted at no charge @ Purdy and Prairie Ridge. Limit 10 Items per visit:

USED MOTOR OIL RECYCLING PROGRAM (Not Accepted at this location)

- Use a **clean** container for draining oil from your vehicle, boat, or lawn mower. **HINT:** Use a reusable container (5 gallon maximum) with a good lid.
- Puncture and drain oil filters for 24 hours before throwing them in the garbage.
- Oil containers must be recycled, reused, or disposed of properly. Garbage rates will apply to the disposal of oil containers.
- Oil must be in a transferable container.
- Disposal limit is five (5) gallons per trip.
- **Never** mix oil with any other substance. Solvents, gas, brake fluid, antifreeze are accepted @ Hidden Valley on Tuesdays and Thursday 8am-12pm and 1pm-5pm.

RECYCLING

Recycling provides a good feedstock of materials to mills for making new products. For this reason, all recyclables must be clean and sorted as outlined below. Contaminated or unsorted materials will be thrown away instead of recycled, so it is up to you to make sure that what you put in the recycling boxes is really ready to be recycled.

PLASTIC BAGS ARE NOT ACCEPTED.
